The Seringuerios of Machinho d'Oeste are traditional artisanal rubber tappers. By state-recognized right, a group of them practice sustainable hunting, gathering, fishing and rubber tapping on 16 reserves in the Machadinho d'Oeste municipality of Brazil's Rondônia State. The traditional, forest-friendly seringueiro lifestyle is in peril. Large logging companies are: intimidating and evicting seringueiros from their lands, deploying tactics like kidnapping, arson and murder to silence resistance, bribing officials to bypass protective laws enabling the takeover of forested land by industrial agriculture and livestock farming.

What can we do? Although Brazilian state policy is menacing their livelihood, the seringueiros are bravely fighting on with the help of Comissao Pastoral da Terra, (The Pastoral Land Commission), an arm of the National Conference of the Bishops of Brazil. In addition to encouraging and empowering them, by signing our Solidarity Letter you will help us advocate for Canada and Brazil to protect the forest and its people.
