

SHIFRA HOMES: Bearing and raising a child is one of the most difficult and yet fulfilling endeavours for a mother. Shifra Homes, serves homeless, pregnant women between the ages of 16-27. Their maternity residence is the only one of its nature in all of Halton. Shifra home accepts women anytime during their pregnancy and supports them for subsequent months after the baby is born. Over the last two years they have expanded their program to create their **Seeds of Hope Program**. Seeds of Hope allows them to continue to support their young families as they transition back into the community and enables them to live independently with access to Shifra Homes' resources. ST. RAPHAEL GREEN CORNER Pope Francis writes: One particularly serious problem is the quality of water available to the poor. Every day, unsafe water results in many deaths and the spread of water-

related diseases, including those caused by chemical substances and microorganisms. Dysentery and cholera, linked to inadequate hygiene and water supplies, are a significant causes of suffering and infant mortality. Underground water sources in many places are threatened by the pollution produced in certain mining, farming and industrial activities, especially in countries lacking adequate regulation or controls. It is not only a question of industrial waste. Detergents and chemical products, commonly used in many places of the world, continue to pour into our rivers, lakes and seas." Laudato Si #29. September 13th is World Groundwater Day It is sometimes thought that water flows through

underground rivers or that it collects in underground lakes. Groundwater is not confined to only a few channels or depressions in the same way that surface water is concentrated in streams and lakes. Rather, it exists almost everywhere underground. It is found underground in the spaces between particles of rock and soil, or in crevices and cracks in rock. Polluted groundwater is less visible, but more difficult to clean up, than pollution in rivers and lakes. Groundwater pollution most often results from improper disposal of wastes on land. Major sources include industrial and household chemicals and garbage landfills, excessive fertilizers and pesticides used in agriculture, industrial waste lagoons, tailings and process wastewater from mines, industrial fracking, oil field brine pits, leaking underground oil storage tanks and pipelines, sewage sludge and septic systems. It is important that we consider the ways that we pollute groundwater in our everyday lives. Using pesticides and

herbicides on gardens and lawns and using excessive amounts of salt in the winter on sidewalks and roads results in these chemicals going into our groundwater and flowing into storm sewers and out into our lakes and streams when it rains or snows. If we are to maintain a high quality of fresh available drinking water it is important to halt/reduce the use of these products. Once an aquifer is contaminated it may be unusable for decades.

It is also important to ensure that motor oil from gas powered engines does not leak into rivers, lakes and sewers. As well, it is important to properly dispose of chemicals such as paints, paint thinners/cleaners and any other chemical in proper ways at Local Waste Collection Facilities and not down storm drains on the road! None of these items should be disposed in regular garbage collections. See
