From the Pastor's Desk:

Today we celebrate the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading tells us how the Lord sent the Prophet Jonah to call the people of Nineveh to turn from their evil ways. The Book of the Prophet Jonah contains only 4 chapters and although it does not have many pages, it is an interesting reading. Usually we acknowledge Jonah along with his adventure on the sea and his mission to the people of Nineveh. Yet, Jonah is pictured as an emotional person who runs away from the presence of the Lord. What motivated him to flee from the Lord is revealed in the last chapter when Jonah becomes angry and displeased by the Lord's mercy. It depicts how the ways of the Lord are beyond our understanding. Being angry and upset solves nothing and directs our thoughts away from the Lord. People becoming angry with their neighbours think they are right and just as Jonah thought but the reality is simply different. Our reflection upon the Prophet Jonah may help us to understand the idea of God's mercy and our need of repentance.

This week we commemorate Saint Vincent, Deacon and Martyr; Saint Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the Church; The Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle; Saint Timothy and Saint Titus, Bishops; and Saint Angela Merici. On January 24th we observe a memorial of St. Francis de Sales. He was born to a noble family in Switzerland in 1567.

He became a priest and a bishop although his family's plans

were different. After working with St. Jane Frances de Chantal he founded a new religious community of nuns named The Order of Visitation. Over 300 years before The Second Vatican Council he taught people what is now called the universal call to holiness. During his time, many people wrongly thought that achieving real holiness of life was a task reserved only for the clergy and those in religious life, and not for lay men and women. In addition, it was commonly believed that only contemplatives, people who withdraw from active participation in the world, could really achieve holiness. Francis gave spiritual direction to lay people who were living real lives in the real world. He had proven with his own life that people could grow in holiness while involved in a very active occupation. He also recognized that Christian marriage and family life is itself a call to holiness. His most famous book Introduction to the Devout Life was written for ordinary lay people in 1608, not just the clergy and religious. It became an instant success all over Europe, although some people tore it up because Francis encouraged dancing and jokes! The key to love God was prayer, he often said. He had special advice for busy people: "Retire at various times into the solitude of your own heart, even while outwardly engaged in discussions or transactions with others and talk to God". He also warned people against gossiping that he acknowledged as a very serious sin. He died in 1622, was beatified in 1661 and canonized in 1965.


