# From the Pastor's Desk:

This Sunday in the Gospel we can see Jesus teaching from a boat in parables. The parables were taken from everyday life so that everyone might understand their meaning. In the present, the Gospel parables sometimes seem to be difficult but in fact they remain simple and understandable. They are not complicated but our lives may be complicated and then our reception becomes limited. In order to receive the message from the Gospel we need to open our ears, minds, and hearts and allow the Holy Spirit to work within us.

This week we commemorate: Saint Romuald, Abbot; Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious; Saint Paulinus of Nola, Bishop; and Saints John Fisher, Bishop and Thomas More, Martyrs.

On Friday June  $22^{nd}$  we observe an optional memorial of Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas More. They were both born in England in the  $15^{th}$  century.

Saint John Fisher was a Roman Catholic Bishop and Cardinal who convinced Lady Margaret Beaufort to found Saint John's College at the University of Cambridge. Saint John Fisher resisted the royal supremacy of King Henry VIII and was tried, condemned and executed in 1535.

Saint Thomas Moore was a married man and lawyer who lived next to a Carthusian Monastery and would often join their spiritual exercises. He became Lord Chancellor in his early 50s and was fiercely loyal to the king. Three years later, Tomas Moore found himself unable to work for King Henry VIII as he felt he had lost his way as a Catholic. Two years later, in 1535, he was finally sentenced to death for opposing the king. His final words were proclaiming that he was "the king's good servant, but God's first".

Today we also observe the Father's Day. We keep all fathers in our prayers.
