# From the Pastor's Desk:

"Oh God [...] pour out, we pray, the gift of the Holy Spirit across the face of the earth." - the Collect of Pentecost Sunday reminds us of the mystery of the day. We ask our Heavenly Father to fill the face of the earth and His Church as well with the gifts of the Holy Spirit so that the faithful may continue Jesus' mission. On the day of Pentecost, the Apostles along with Mary were gathered together in prayer at the same place that Jesus had His last supper with them. After receiving the Holy Spirit, the scared Apostles became courageous heralds of the Gospel. They not only started speaking various languages but first of all they brought forth the Gospel to the ends of the earth. On Pentecost the Church began its public mission and this mission is still continued by the disciples of Jesus with the power of the Holy Spirit. The key idea of experiencing miracles is to remain faithful to the Gospel. Fear always appears when we want to change the Gospel even of a small amount.

Today we welcome with great joy a newly ordained priest Fr. Grayson Hope who presides and preaches these weekend Masses. We are happy to receive the blessing from the hands of the newly ordained priest. Pentecost Sunday concludes the joyful season of Easter. On Monday we begin Ordinary Time in the liturgy.

This week we commemorate: Mary, Mother of the Church; Saint Eugene de Mazenod, Bishop; Saint Christopher Magallanes, Priest and Martyr and Companions; Saint Rita of Cascia, Religious; Blessed Louis – Zephirin Morneau, Bishop; Saint Bede the Venerable, Priest and Doctor of the Church; Saint Greggory VII, Pope; Saint Mary Magdalene De'Pazzi, Virgin; and Saint Philip Neri, Priest.

This year for the very first time, the Church in Canada celebrates the memorial of Mary Mother of the Church by the decree of Pope Francis. Mary the Mother of Jesus is also the Mother of the Church and an example for the faithful indicating how to perfectly fulfil the will of the Father. We are happy that we can honour Our Lady under such a beautiful title.

On Thursday May 24<sup>th</sup> a world day of prayer for the Church in China is observed. In 2007 Pope Benedict XVI chose this day since it is the traditional Feast of Our Lady of Help of Christians, venerated at the Shrine in Shanghai. Let us keep the Church in China in our prayers.
