From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends,

In the month of November we pray in a special way for our deceased brothers and sisters. In the sanctuary there is a Book of Life, in which we can write the names of our loved ones. This and next Sunday, the 9 am Mass will be offered for all whose names that are written in the Book of Life. This weekend we also pray for those Canadians who gave their lives in war. After all Masses we will sing the national anthem *O Canada*.

This week we commemorate Saint Albert the Great, Bishop and Doctor of the Church; Saint Margaret of Scotland; Saint Gertrude; Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious and the Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.

On November 15th we celebrate an optional memorial of St. Albert the Great. He was born sometime before 1200. He was a German Dominican friar and bishop. He was called the greatest philosopher and theologian of the Middle Ages. Albert along with his student Thomas Aquinas and several other contemporary leaders of the Dominican Order created a program of study for the Dominican friars and developed a curriculum for philosophy. From this course of study would later arise the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas, in Rome. Today, the university that is known as the "Angelicum," is one of the foremost theological colleges in the world. It is still run by the Dominican Order.

On November 18th we observe the Dedication of the Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul. St. Peter's Basilica is probably the most famous church in Christendom. It was erected in the 4th century on the Vatican Hill where according to tradition St. Peter was buried after his martyrdom. St. Paul's Basilica called Outside-the-Walls was as well built in the 4th century where St. Paul is believed to have been beheaded. By the decree of Pope St. Pius X bishops are obligated to make a quinquennial visit to the tombs of the Apostles in Rome to report to the Supreme Pontiff on the status of their dioceses. In Rome there are four basilicas that are called major. Any other basilica throughout the world is named minor, including our Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King in Hamilton. Through the act of dedication the church becomes a holy place exclusively committed to Divine Worship.
