From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends,

Pope Francis this year on June 13th, while celebrating a memorial of St. Anthony of Padua, established a World Day of the Poor. Today on the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time we observe this feast for the very first time. In conclusion of his letter, Pope Francis tell us: "This new World Day, therefore, should become a powerful appeal to our consciences as believers, allowing us to grow in the conviction that sharing with the poor enables us to understand the deepest truth of the Gospel. The poor are not a problem: they are a resource from which to draw as we strive to accept and practise in our lives the essence of the Gospel."

This week we commemorate The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary; Saint Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr; Saint Clement I, Pope; Saint Columban, Religious; Saints Andrew Dung – Lac and Companions, Martyrs; Saint Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin and Martyr.

On November 21st we celebrate a memorial of The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. According to tradition, Mary's parents, Joachim and Anne, who had been childless, received a heavenly message that they would have a child. In thanksgiving for the gift of their daughter, they brought her, when still a child, to the Temple in Jerusalem to

consecrate her to God. The feast originated as a result of the dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary the New, built in 543 by the Byzantines under Emperor Justinian I. Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.

On November 24th we observe a memorial of St. Andrew Dung – Lac and Companions. Andrew was in Vietnam and after his conversion into Catholic faith he was ordained to the priesthood. He was one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam between 1860 and 1862. Members of the companions group gave their lives for Christ in the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries, and received beatification during four different occasions between 1900 and 1951. All were canonized by Pope Saint John Paul II.

Next Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, which concludes the liturgical year.
