From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Jesus Christ, King of the Universe commonly known as the Feast of Christ the King. This solemnity concludes the liturgical year. The liturgy of the last Sunday of the year always leads our thoughts to heaven. The Church reminds us of our final destination where we all are heading through our earthly pilgrimage. Our leader on this way is our Lord Jesus Christ who reigns from the cross and who wants to embrace everyone with His open arms.

This Sunday at 3 pm in the church there will be a presentation about the Divine Mercy Devotion, its theological meaning and great significance. All are welcome to attend.

This week we observe Saint Andrew, Apostle and the first Friday and Saturday of the month.

On November 30th we celebrate a feast of St. Andrew. He came from Bethsaida in Galilee and he was a brother of Simon Peter. They were both fishermen. According to the Gospel of St. John, Andrew was a disciple of St. John the Baptist. Andrew first acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah and followed Jesus and brought his brother to the Lord. Andrew is said to found the Episcopal See of Byzantium (later named Constantinople and Istanbul) installing Stachys as its first bishop. This diocese would later developed into the Patriarchate of Constantinople and Andrew along with

Stachys are recognized as its patron saints. Another tradition says that St. Andrew with his missionary work reached distant regions of the East up to Kiev in Ukraine. Therefore, Ukraine, Romania and Russia acknowledge him as their patron saint too. It is said that Andrew was crucified at the city of Patras and he was bound, not nailed, to a Latin cross of the kind on which Jesus had died. Yet, in accordance to tradition, Andrew at his own request was crucified on a cross of the form called *crux decussata* (X-shaped cross), today commonly known as a "Saint Andrew's Cross". He deemed himself unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus had been.

On the first Friday and Saturday of the month we honour respectively in a special way the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Both devotions are popular among the faithful throughout the world and numerous people have received special graces observing them. Next Sunday we welcome a new liturgical year celebrating the First Sunday of Advent.
