# From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends,

This weekend we have a special Marian celebration with the Statue of Our Lady of the Cape. We welcome Father Wedner Bernard OMI who accompanies the Statue and leads the celebration. The Sanctuary of Our Lady of the Cape is a national shrine to the Blessed Virgin and it is located at Trois-Rivières, in the district of Cap-de- la-Madeleine, half-way between Montreal and Quebec City. The beginnings of the shrine are quite interesting. They are connected with two miracles, which later were called *The Ice Bridge* and *The Miracle of The Eyes*. Pleas, feel encouraged to find the details.

This week we observe memorials of: Saint Marguerite D'Youville, Religious; Saint Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop and Martyr; Saint Luke, Evangelist; Saint Paul of the Cross, Priest; Saint Hedwig, Religious and Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin.

On October 17<sup>th</sup> we commemorate a memorial of St. Ignatius of Antioch. He was an early Christian writer and bishop of Antioch. On his way to Rome, where he met his martyrdom in 107, he wrote a series of letters to the faithful. This correspondence now forms a significant part of the collection known as the Apostolic Fathers and also serves as early Christian theology. He was the first who used in writing the phrase "Catholic Church". He converted to Christian faith in his youth. Tradition says that Ignatius was a disciple of St. John the Apostle and that he was one of the children whom Jesus took in his arms and blessed. Ignatius called himself *Theoforos* which means God Bearer. Ignatius taught the deity of Christ, emphasized the great value of the Eucharist calling it *a medicine of immortality*, and stressed loyalty to a local bishop.

On October 20th we observe an optional memorial of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. She lived in the 17th century in France as a Visitation nun and mystic (she belonged to The Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary) who promoted the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In her convent at Paray-le-Monial, she received several private revelations of Jesus. During one of them Jesus let her rest her head upon His heart and disclosed to her the wonders of His love telling her that He desired to make them known to all mankind and to diffuse the treasures of His goodness, and that He had chosen her for this work. The form of the devotion that Jesus requested contains reparations for sins on the first Friday of the month by participation in Mass and reception of Holy Communion (now known as First Friday Devotion), Eucharistic Adoration during a holy hour on Thursday (to commemorate Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane) and celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus presented by Margaret, was officially approved 75 years after her death. She was beatified in 1864 and canonized in 1920. When her tomb was canonically opened in July 1830, two instantaneous cures were recorded to have taken place. Her incorrupt body rests above the side altar in the Chapel of the Apparitions, located at the Visitation Monastery in Paray-le-Monial, and many striking blessings have been claimed by pilgrims attracted there from all parts of the world.
