

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

The fourth Sunday of Easter is often called Good Shepherd Sunday. It is a good time to reflect on this and to pray for the pastors of the Church.

The Lamb of God who was slain is the Good Shepherd. This truth of our faith is celebrated in the scripture readings this Sunday. The suffering that Jesus endured for love, completed on the cross is the pattern for the Church to know the love of God for all. The Church's mission is to follow His example throughout the world for every age. Sts Paul and Barnabas suffered as they proclaimed this Word in their time, and they rejoiced that they could suffer for the sake of the Gospel. The book of Revelations celebrates the myriads of those who endured their trials and who now wear the white garment of those who are washed clean in the Blood of the Lamb in the festal gathering of God's eternal kingdom. We need not be surprised then when we as a Church are called to suffer in our witness to the Gospel teachings as the Church continues to herald the gift of human life as the greatest manifestation of God's presence in Jesus.

We believe that this gift of life for each of us is purified as our sins are forgiven because the Lamb of God has paid the price for our forgiveness and left us a pattern to follow. There has perhaps never been a time in Church history when the values based on this belief have been more subtly threatened. Often the teachings of the Church are dismissed as archaic, and the sins of its priests are singled out as a demonstration of this opinion. This is the logic of a lie. The Church has always taught that all sin is evil. Still we believe sins are forgiven and washed clean by the blood of the Lamb and we celebrate this in the holy sacrament of penance where we find reconciliation with God and other people. When we consider that the Pope and the bishops as the chief shepherds, ordained by the Church and heralds of the gospel are now under siege for the sake of their witness to the teachings of the church, we need not be surprised that the world does not understand. The world did not recognize Jesus even as his Word and work was proclaimed and continued by his first followers.

We are called to follow the Good Shepherd and to be guided by his teaching and example as they are sustained and brought forward in our time by the Pope and the Bishops who are descendents of the Apostles. These were the first witnesses whose lives were formed in the pattern of Jesus as the first who came to believe in the Atonement accomplished by the blood of the Lamb of God. Jesus, our Chief Shepherd, founded the Church on the Apostles and martyrs who laid down their lives in the pattern that He established on the cross. In this Easter Season we continue to proclaim this Good News, that by His Cross and Resurrection we are set free, by the Saviour of the world. In every age, we are called to reconciliation and conversion. This time is no different. Led as we are by the Good Shepherd as he is proclaimed in the Church. We can find peace and comfort in the guidance and help of the Holy Spirit who inspires our Pope and Bishop to guide us in His way, the way of the Cross that leads to new life and Resurrection. This is the reconciliation Jesus won for us. Let us pray for our Church leaders especially on this day.

Please pray for me, also as your parish pastor that I may follow faithfully in this Way and help to guide you all to know and love Jesus our Good Shepherd more each day.
