Palm Sunday



The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to All!

A blessed Palm Sunday and Holy Week to all.

These past forty days of lent have provided us a time of prayerful preparation to open our hearts and minds to experience the Word of God that is demonstrated in the life death and resurrection of Jesus. He is the Incarnation of Love. Today we begin the Holy Week set aside for the Church to remember and deeply contemplate the Love of God given for us to realize in the Celebrations and Sacraments we are given to receive. To begin we remember the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, and then recount the events that lead to His death on the cross and his burial in the tomb. The sad and solemn story is read today for this year, from gospel of Matthew. The injustice and scandalous suffering of Jesus that we remember in the hearing is complicated an involving many characters and facets. As we are gathered here to listen this long and sad story once again, it is an experience we share with faithful believers throughout the world. It is an experience of hope in the Resurrection that followed the terrible death of Jesus on the Cross. Passion Sunday recalls the whole story in the passion gospel, to prepare us to walk thoroughly, through the events there recounted in the liturgies that will be celebrated in Holy Week. There is too much to digest fully in one liturgy, and so the memory of the events that occurred are celebrated specially in the Triduum liturgy of Holy Thursday Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. The three celebrations happen in one liturgical procession solemnly extended in these three days to facilitate our deepest contemplation of the love of God they are meant to communicate to us and to the whole world.

We invite and encourage all to participate fully in the celebration of the Easter Triduum. The liturgy opens on Holy Thursday remembering the Last Supper that celebrates the institution of the Holy Eucharist; "the Source and Summit of the Life of the Church" In this liturgy we remember how Jesus came to serve and it is demonstrated in the ritual washing the feet of the disciples. Good Friday recalls once again the passion narrative. Unlike Palm Sunday when the synoptic gospels are read, the Gospel of John is read which subtly reflects already the Risen Christ who is triumphant even in His death on the Holy Cross. The Easter Vigil is the holiest liturgy of the year and its celebration is made most glorious when it completes what was begun in the Holy Thursday celebrations. The Easter Vigil is the grand celebration of salvation history. All salvation is recounted in this glorious liturgy that begins with the lighting of the Easter Fire, the exhultet, sung for the easter candle that lights the way through the Gloria of the Bells to the Easter Proclamation, He is Risen as he Said. The Catecumens and members of the RCIA community will receive the Easter Sacraments in the Easter Vigil liturgy and so it is most sincerely a time of new life and new beginnings for our whole parish community. Following the Vigil mass there is a reception in the hall to congratulate these new members and to welcome them to the fullness of life in the Church.

Much preparation and coordination goes into the celebration of these liturgies and we are deeply grateful to all of the ministers, musicians, educators, and volunteers who so generously contribute to the life and worship of the community that is brought to fullness in the celebration of the triduum. May the Holy Spirit inspire and help us in all that we do to give glory to God in this holy time of remembrance of the Pascal Mysteries of Christ in the Church.

Taavi wasn't engaged at his school or in extracurricular sports and as a Deaf person, he faced obstacles trying to join his hearing peers. His mom encouraged him to try to participate in the Deaf community. His life changed when he joined a Deaf basketball fun day hosted by Silent Voice and met Mike, Director of the Silent Voice Child and Family Program. He joined a Deaf sports team, began a co-op position with Silent Voice in his 4th year of high school, and was hired as a counselor in the Silent Voice Sign Language Summer day camp. He continues to volunteer at Silent Voice and says, "I'm grateful to ShareLife –supported Silent Voice and want to be a role model for Deaf kids, like Mike was to me." Last year more than 600 deaf children received help through ShareLife-supported Silent Voice's Sign Language Summer Camps. Next ShareLife Sunday is May 7, 2017 Please give generously.
