

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

"My House shall be a house of prayer for all people." These words of Isaiah appear on the signage of Synagogues and Churches of many different denominations throughout the world. The words express God's intention for all to know they are welcome and at home in the places that gather people to worship the one true God. Hospitality is a value that reflects the unconditional love and acceptance that God offers from the love and goodness that is offered in grace so that all may come to know love and serve God in freedom and peace.

Jesus is the image of the invisible God who reveals the spirit of God's love and acceptance in the relationships that are demonstrated in the gospels. Each encounter that Jesus has is as unique as the persons he encountered. This is shown quite strikingly in this Sunday's Gospel, as Jesus encounters the Canaanite woman even as the disciples discourage the encounter. Jesus, himself speaks words to her that would be off putting to anyone, yet she calls Him to task as she uses his own words to bring him to recognize her faith in who He is. "Great is your faith" he acknowledges, "it shall be done as you wish". Even though she is not a Child of Israel, she recognizes Him, the Son of David, the one who can heal her daughter. What an inspiration this gospel is to all of us to recognize the gift of faith in God that is offered to all people of every race, language, religion and way of life through Jesus.

The gospel reveals God's desire for the unity in faith of all humankind even in its wonderful diversity. Just as the Canaanite woman challenges Jesus to recognize her faith even as one who is not of the house of Israel, so we are challenged to recognize the gift of faith in God that may reveal itself through the lives of others who may be of different traditions than our own. Such recognition requires attentiveness and listening to others in ways that go deeper than the externals of religious or ethnic identity. This requires respect and an inherent acceptance of the dignity that God gives to every human person.

The Gospel today invites us to consider the value of inter-faith and ecumenical dialogue that is promoted by the Church. These values are at the heart of the mission of the Church. These are the foundational values of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement the community in which I am professed, and the sponsors of St. Joan of Arc Parish. It is always a joy for me to see the welcome and hospitality that is consistently offered to all by this parish community. It confirms the special relationship and charismatic aspect of the Atonement Friars with St. Joan of Arc in our service.

This coming year we will continue to extend our ministerial outreach in ecumenical and interfaith activities both liturgically through the advent lessons and carols, the week of prayer for Christian Unity, and charitably through the Winter Welcome Table, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Social outreaches, like Merrymakers, the Social Committee, Development and Peace and the shared cooperation now established with the interfaith garden to grow vegetables for the various charitable tables that are served throughout Toronto. All of these services and outreaches help us to actualize the mandate that is given that God's house shall be a house of prayer for all people. Let us thank God for the grace we are given to sustain these opportunities and to recognize God's presence in all we are and do.
