

Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Mission Statement: To live the Gospel message by serving Christ in the poor with love, respect, justice and joy.

The Society was formed in 1833, when Frederic Ozanam and a group of students from the Sorbonne University were challenged to prove their faith in Christ through action, not just words. They accepted the challenge and the society, was formed to work with the desperately poor in Paris. They developed a simple system, where, they went in teams to help the poor in their homes, the streets, in hospitals and in asylums.

This work is continued today worldwide, following the tradition of small working groups, known as conferences. A conference is parish based: such as, St. Joan of Arc Conference. The parish-based Vincentians make up the fundamental unit which enables them to serve those in need through personto-person contact. Emergency assistance is given with food, clothing and furniture managed through a voucher system

What do we do?

We assist families in our area with food and clothing vouchers, through the generosity of you, the parishioners who support our poor boxes. Also, when possible, we try to provide furniture when needed. (Our appeals through the bulletin). Give Christmas help, giving toys and gift cards collected on St. Nicholas Day along with food vouchers, to families in need of them.

*.All conferences can send girls to camp for a week in the summer to Marygrove Camp for girls. This is a fully subsidized programme for girls 5 to 13 yrs. of age. 1,200 girls attend the camp each summer.

* All conferences hold "Bundle Weekends" to collect gently used items that can be given free of charge to those in need, through the voucher system in our stores.

There are other ministries within the society.

* The Prison Apostolate and Court Services, "Twinning" with other Conferences councils in Canada and around the world.

*Residential Programmes: Women's Emergency and Transitional Housing *Residences for men and women who have experienced mental illness and are unable to care for themselves without support.

* The Society provides transitional accommodation and support for men recently discharged from detox centres and awaiting entry into an addiction treatment programme.

*Vince Paul Community Homes provide men and women recovering from addiction, with the support and encouragement needed to build a new life. We have 12 homes located in Metro.

*We have homes that offer residential care and support for 12 men and women who are developmentally handicapped. They live in a loving community, learn basic life skills and share in basic decision-making processes.

Our conference is part of Toronto West Particular Council along with other west end conferences, under the umbrella of the Toronto Central Council. Our main focus is to provide assistance to the less fortunate, of our own community. *Thank you for your continued support!*
