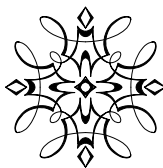

The Pastor's Corner

On this second Sunday of Lent we remember the Transfiguration of Jesus on the Mountain with the disciples where He is revealed as the Son of God. This experience is one which brought hope to the disciples in the midst of their trials and brings us light for our Lenten journey. Last week our Catechumens were presented at to the Cardinal at St. Paul's Basilica and so we walk together with them to grow in faith and hope on our symbolic pilgrimage to Jerusalem.
