

The Friar's Nook

One thing that was presented this past week to the staff and some volunteers at Saint Joan of Arc from the general counsel of the Friars was the mission, vision, and values of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement. This was a document we have been working on for several years and now we're hoping that each of our ministries will adapt it and use it, in their own right so that it follows who we are and informs what we do. Our mission, vision, and values speak of carrying our message out to the world but also speak to us as a message that should ring true as to who see ourselves as.

At Saint Joan of Arc, there are lots of ways in which our mission carries us outward, Development & Peace, Saint Vincent DePaul, Winter Welcome Table, Catholic Women's League, and Creation Care Ministry are just some of the ways we reach out to others in the world. Our Religious Education programs, beginning with Baptism Classes, Communion and Reconciliation Prep, Confirmation Classes, and Bible Study as well as various adult education programs, serve to develop our understanding of who we are as Christians and members of a parish. As Friars we talk about "womb to tomb" formation, that is that education is lifelong not just for those starting out. That means that we also need to be open to change ourselves – not that only others need to change!

I know that no one likes to change but this is about growth. We are called to grow as long as we are drawing breath. As a parish we are growing, as is witnessed by the new, young families we are seeing. We need to continue to be formed so that we can evangelize in our world and our lives. To aid in that, I will be resuming on-line bible study on Wednesdays at 2 PM on the letters of St. Paul on our website. Also, all of the Bible Studies that I have done are available there. I will also be posting other things you can do for Lent on our website so keep an eye open for opportunities.

I am encouraged by the hope we have and even though we have been operating at a deficit since COVID, I think we can and will continue to grow as a parish.
