

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity began this past Wednesday. The scriptural theme this year is taken from 1Corinthians, 15:51-58: "We will all be changed by the Victory of our Lord Jesus Christ" The week of prayer is promoted by the World Council of Churches and the Vatican Office of Ecumenism. This tradition was founded by Fr. Paul Wattson, the founder of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement while our community was still in the Anglican Church. In the years that followed, the community entered the Roman Catholic Church where we continue the ministry to pray and work for the unity of Christians, and to promote harmonious interfaith relationship with all of the major world religions. Throughout this week we will be praying for these efforts at all of our masses.
