The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to All!

This week the Church in all her Christian denominations and traditions celebrates the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The annual Week of Prayer for Christian unity is celebrated from January 18 – 25 each year to promote Ecumenical participation in sharing the prayer that Jesus prayed "That all may be one, as You Father are in me and I am in you that the world may believe". This prayer from the gospel of John, Chapter 17:vs 21 and following reflects the longing of the Lord that Christians may be united in worship and witness to realize the mission of Jesus to bring salvation to all. The week of prayer was started as a world movement by Servant of God, Rev. Paul Wattson, SA the founder of the Franciscan Friars and Sisters of the Atonement in 1908 while the Society of the Atonement was still in the Anglican Church. In the process of prayer and conversion, the Franciscan Friars and Sisters of the Society of the Atonement entered the Roman Catholic Church as a corporate body and have continued to promote this annual effort to pray for the unity of all Christians to give witness to the prayer of Jesus. Each year throughout the world Christians gather during the week of prayer sharing Ecumenical worship in various denominational venues to demonstrate the profound importance and value of praying together to heal the divisions that have been a source of sorrow and scandal for so many centuries. The Archdiocese of Toronto participates annually in various churches throughout the GTA to celebrate this holy week of prayer. This year the celebration will be held at St. Michaels Cathedral, with Cardinal Thomas Collins, as he gathers with clergy and laity of many different Christian denominational churches to pray together in shared witness and worship. The celebration will be held this year on January 29th at 3:00 PM. All are invited to attend and I pray many of our parishioners will make an effort to be present for this celebration.

This past week three high school Students, from Bishop Marocco/Thomas Merton High School gathered here at St. Joan of Arc, with their teacher Teresa Kelly and three student film and sound technicians to interview me and to discuss the importance of the Ecumenical Movement and the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Two of these students have submitted essays in the annual Week of Prayer Essay contest that is promoted by the Archdiocese of Toronto and the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement. What a wonderful inspiration these young people bring their enthusiasm and concern for Christian Unity into the present and future life of the Church. Along with the concerns of Ecumenism and prayer for Christian Unity, the focus of interfaith dialogue and understanding was a part of the concern these youth discussed in our interview they give us new hope for a future of mutuality and understanding among people of every, race, language and way of life. May God Bless them richly in their lives and good witness to the Gospel.

Development and Peace met this week also to plan and promote the theme of reconciliation and understanding among aboriginal people with the Kairos Blanket exercise that they will sponsor here at St. Joan of Arc. Please stop by the special display they have posted on their board to advertise this special event. The efforts to promote Ecumenical prayer and dialogue along with interfaith understanding is central to our faith and witness as followers of Jesus Christ who came that all may find salvation in Him who is the way the truth and the life of God with us.
