

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Some of you may remember Brother James Daly. He served here while in formation as a friar and was involved in our RCIA program. When he was recently diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer the Friars and Sister of the Atonement launched a Novena for his healing. Our parish participated. Br. James wrote the following letter to us and so I share it in this column. I am reminded during this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity that prayer of intercession for healing is one that always crosses religious boundaries. Gratitude has that same power and Br. Jim's letter reflects this.

Fr. Dan

I hope that this letter finds you all doing well and the New Year although young treating you kindly. I wanted to write to all of you sooner but it was impossible for me to do so.

I was overcome with emotion when I read that a novena was going to be said for my healing by our community of sisters and friars. Such an outpouring of love and support can only humble one and make one look deeper into their lives as to where they are on this journey called life. These past eight days and prior knowing that sisters and friars were praying for my healing all over the world was moving to say the least. There are no words that I could put to paper that could adequately express my sincere gratitude. I can only say that I am truly grateful and blessed to belong to a community such as the Society of Atonement. One thing that is continuously mentioned by both friends and doctors is that I try and keep a positive attitude and my spirits high. I believe it is impossible to do otherwise with all the love and support I have been and continue to be surrounded with. Your emails, cards, phone calls, visits and hello's in passing have all attributed to my faith, my hope and keeping my spirits high.

On Tuesday of this week I will be having my 3rd chemo session and the last one of the first cycle. I will be getting three chemo treatments over a four week period which will constitute one complete cycle. After three complete cycles (approximately 16 weeks) I will have more tests (MRI, CSCAN, XRAY, etc.) done to determine how the chemo is working. This should be sometime in late March. I believe that science is a gift from God for us to use for the betterment of society. Yet science does not get the last word. God will determine the outcome and I place myself in God's Hands.

Again my sincere thanks to all of you my brothers and sisters for all your prayers, love and support. Please continue to keep me in your prayers. I know there will be intercession and healing. How that intercession and healing manifest itself will be God's choice. I look forward to seeing more of you around as my recovery improves. Stay well and may God bless us all.
