

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

PEACE AND ALL GOOD TO ALL!

This week the Church throughout the world reflects on our communal vocation to reflect God's grace and power through the mystery of the Beatitudes as Jesus taught: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs." Paul's letter invites us: "Consider your own calling brothers and sisters. Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong, and God chose the lowly and despised of the world, those who count for nothing ,to reduce to nothing those who are something, so that no human being might boast before God." These attitudes and insights presented to us in the readings this Sunday cannot be grasped or understood without the gift of Faith as the foundation of our awareness and relationship to God in Christ Jesus. This is the ground of our shared relationship with one another in the Love of God that is engendered by our faith. Sustaining our awareness to live in the mind of Christ that is so clearly represented in these readings requires a prayerful approach to our everyday lives as we strive to live and grow in these gospel values. It is in our shared awareness and agreement to live the beatitudes that we create a truly Christian community of faith and love in which others may find welcome invitation to our way of life in the Church. Sustaining these values and sharing our faith is also the way in which individuals may grow to exercise the gifts and talents that God is calling us to use in serving the ministry of the Church. Because God chooses the lowly of this world to complete the mission of the Church, we come to realize the great mystery of Salvation in Jesus Christ.

This past week, I attended meetings of the Atonement Friars and one of the urgent issues that we discussed is the great need for vocations to religious life and priesthood. This prompted me to consider the need to discuss the real urgency of promoting vocations to religious life by bringing us all to a greater awareness of the need to pray and invite individuals to consider religious vocations as a way of life and service to the Church that is a part of who we are as a stewardship community.

Vocations are given by God but can only be heard and responded to in faith hope and love. These three great gifts of God are planted and nurtured in the Church which lives in the world through faithful families, Church communities and Christian organizations that promote the way of Jesus as the model and goal of life and service. As stewards of our gifts to serve the parish, all of us fulfill our Christian vocations. In our Stewardship retreat we focused on the Eucharist as the source and summit of our stewardship vocation and mission. If we stop to consider the leadership that is necessary to gather us to worship, to hear the Gospel and to celebrate Eucharist, we might also realize the necessity of Religious and Priestly vocations as central to our gathering and organization as a Church.

Religious and priestly vocations do not happen in a vacuum, they are nurtured and encouraged by the believing community who identify individuals who may be called to serve the Church as priests or religious leaders empowered to gather the community and celebrate the sacraments. When I was a child, to speak of vocations automatically meant Priesthood Sisterhood or Brotherhood in the Church. Since Vatican II, the broader notion of vocation has allowed us all to appreciate a common call to serve through Baptism. Vocations to religious life and priesthood were considered a welcome privilege to families and communities, and so were encouraged and supported as a wonderful and special calling. The attitudes and values of the community regarding vocations was an important part of the desire to become a priest or a religious for a young person considering what to do with their lives. This is still true, and it is something we need to consider in our own hearts and minds. What would it mean to us if a member of our own families or circle of friends were to consider priesthood or religious life for themselves at this point in time? What is your attitude or your family's attitude in this matter?

Jesus prayed in his own time that the Father would send labourers into the field, because the harvest is great but the labourers are few. We are graced to have so many stewards to serve our community, but the specific need for individuals called and gifted to serve as priests and religious continues to be an important part of our life and ministry. Let us pray that God will call young men and women to serve as leaders of the Church in priesthood and religious life. Let us also pray that we may identify and encourage individuals who may have a particular calling to serve the Church as priests and religious.

May God Bless you richly in Love and Grace.
