

# The Friars Nook

I was reading in the paper this week, and it's hard to believe but it's been one year since COVID came to Canada. Canadians have always been very welcoming, certainly to me, but I wish you weren't so welcoming the pandemic! It's a different world than it was a year ago. Apart from the financial strains that abound, the social strains continue to manifest themselves. I had a funeral this past week with only nine family members allowed to attend. It was sad because some had to choose to attend the funeral and others that you chose to attend the graveside service. You, shouldn't have to make those kind of choices but, in the world that we live in, with a pandemic still active in our lives that's what we're left with. As you know the church is closed until one week before Ash Wednesday, but I fear that that will be extended into Lent. I join you in your frustration that the vaccination has not been rolled out as quickly as we had hoped, but we need to remain vigilant in our lives and care for each other in the meantime. I hope this year we will be able to celebrate Holy Week together again even if that means limited number of people in the church. It's sure beats an empty church like we had last year.

As most of you know, I am an extrovert and not having people to talk to, to share with, even just to be around, has been a major hardship for me. I have a whole new relationship with my computer though between Zoom meetings and online Bible studies, I have spent a lot more time sitting in this chair than I care too! I'm glad that we can at least reach out to you.

In the meantime, we are trying to move forward, ever so slowly, with the life of the church in this pandemic. We are challenged with sacramental preparation when we can't meet with the kids, and some things work much better face to face. As Cardinal Collins said: "We are an incarnational church", Christ comes to be one of us and it's in relationship to each other that we are in relation with God. We are fortunate that we have people who are working hard trying to maintain those contacts. I will be online for now and we will continue to strive to make those connections in person when we can.

I don't think anyone took me up on the offer to come and see our new trash and recycle bins so I'm upping the ante! We now have new handrails attached to the outside wall of the church as you come in from Bloor Street. Now when people can come back to the church, they should have an easier [and safer] time coming up the stairs. As you are reading this online, you'll be happy to know that our new parish website is in process! We've seen the first draft and it looks promising. It should be easy to use and we will have a calendar available on the site. Now all we have to do is wait for the pandemic to be over and we can actually fill up the calendar with things that are happening here in the parish! I am grateful to the Stewardship Committee who has been spearheading this and moving us forward. The Building Committee as well has been no slouch, doing whatever they can during this time of shutdown to make the church a better place for you.

Since the isolation brought on by the pandemic increases the stress in our lives, I invite you to reach out end call or email those parishioners who may be alone and under greater stress just to say hi and that you're thinking of them.
