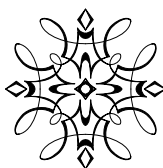

The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to All!

Seek first the Kingdom of God and all else will be provided for you. This is the theme of the Sunday readings, from Solomon's request for a discerning heart, to the pearl of great price in the Gospel that motivated its finder to sell all and purchase it. Finding the Lord in our lives and making Christ the center creates a balance that permits everything else to be in its proper place so that our relationships and responsibilities are met joyfully and with the help of God. Life always brings challenges, and managing them wisely is not possible without guidance from the Holy Spirit who is our helper. Summer time as swiftly as it passes, often provides us more quiet time to appreciate God's gifts and assistance.

This past Thursday evening, the Ministries committee met for a leisurely dinner in the garden to relax and discuss the past year and to contemplate the coming year and the ministerial needs of the parish that are likely to unfold. It was a fruitful gathering that was not pressed with the usual agenda items, schedules and expectations to be met and realized within a certain time. Rather it was a time for talking about what might be the best ways to listen to the parishioners, and consider the needs we have as a parish to fulfill the Mission of Christ that has been given us. Three years ago it was at such a gathering that we discussed the idea of a parish survey that was then conducted that September. The results of that survey directed many of our plans as it surfaced many of the needs and ideas that came forward from the parish. Developments in religious education RCIA and adult education came about as a result of that survey. The developing youth ministry was also first considered from the survey and it is now unfolding in a way that gives us great hope for the future. Some of the ongoing efforts to develop parish organizations to function well in light of the busy schedules continue to be matters we consider in planning for the year. Improving our communication through the new website, and other means help make it possible to invite others to become Stewards of our parish ministries.

It was identified that we will be looking for more volunteer teachers and assistants for the religious education and sacramental preparation programs, and volunteers for our many stewardship groups and organizations. In September, we will have our annual Stewardship Sunday and the lead up to this will be announced in future bulletins and pulpit announcements. This summer has given us some time to contemplate the ways that God is calling us forward, and so we ask that you continue to pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and assist us as we prepare for the coming year. May Our Lady the Atonement, and Good Council pray for us always.
