

A Message from the Parish Re-Opening Committee

Hello Dear Parishioners of St Joan of Arc,

As you know, Parishes "may" open for Mass and prayer starting this weekend IF they have sufficient safety protocols in place. In order to open safely, the Parish requires many volunteers to act as Ushers/Directors and to sanitize everything after each Liturgy. This weekend we have been fortunate to receive enough volunteers to open two weekend Masses, Saturday at 5:30 and Sunday at 10. The capacity of our worship space will allow for 82 people (depending of families sitting together) for each Mass. We are asking people to wear a face mask at Mass.

Please note also that in addition to weekend Masses, the church will be open from 4 to 6 every weekday for prayer and the celebration of daily Mass.

We will be continuing to assess the status of our volunteer numbers and make every effort, with your help, to open more Masses as we go along. Please email to stewardship@joanofarc.ca if you are interested in helping in the future. Please let us know if you would USHER or CLEAN or BOTH and for WHICH MASS(ES) you are available for. If we receive enough volunteers, we may be able to safely open more Masses in the future.

The Sunday Mass at 10:00 will continue to be streamed for everyone who chooses to view in their home. The Cardinal has removed the Sunday obligation for the duration of the pandemic so don't feel that you must get to church now.

Instructions from me.

Once the church is filled to safe capacity or Mass has begun, the front door will be closed and locked. This will ensure that those who came early to usher will be able to participate in Mass.

The Piazza and the handicapped ramp are marked at 6-foot intervals. Please respect this distance. Only the front door by the office will be used for entrance. There is hand sanitizer in the lobby where the Holy Water was, we ask you to use it and then follow an usher to a spot in the pews. Everyone must be seated by an usher! Pews are marked with blue tape as to where you are allowed to sit. No one will be allowed to sit on the aisles. The center aisle is marked at 6-foot intervals to maintain safe distancing. Communion will only be distributed in the hand. You will receive instructions on how to proceed for communion at Mass.

The only washroom that is available is the one in the lobby. Someone must sanitize it after each use so please only use it if absolutely necessary. After Mass, everyone will need to exit immediately. Please follow the usher guidance. Everyone will exit by the front doors on the right side. Please do not congregate outside on the Plaza but keep moving to the sidewalk or the parking lot.

Things will be different but for now this is the new "normal".

We had one number last week, that we thought we allowed to have in the church *for mass*. Only, to find the number has been deceased by social distancing. Things will continue to change as time goes on, and we ask that you be patient with us. We need volunteers and we need people to follow the guidelines given to the parish in order to stay open.
