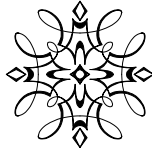

## *The Friar's Nook*

### *HAPPY SUMMER!*

It has been a rough start for me going into the summer season, as I have been recovering from strep throat and bronchitis. Hopefully all these illnesses are behind me for the rest of the year! With the warmer weather come some positive changes here at Saint Joan of Arc.

During this past week we have at a company working on all the external doors to the church. You may or may not have known that many of the doors did not work or work well. It took us quite some time to find even a company that would work with us, but we finally found one and they have replaced hardware, adjusted the doors, and now, believe it or not, the doors all open and close with ease. It doesn't take much to make me happy - working doors certainly is one of those things.

The other thing we are working on, which we have put off during COVID, is the air conditioning in the church. We have four rooftop units of which only two are working but I decided that during COVID we couldn't afford to spend money on this. Fortunately, the two working units have been able to hold up until we were able to replace them. We have four new units that are energy-efficient to be installed in the church. This should make the church much more comfortable in the Summertime because with only two units working, they were blowing much colder air to make up for the other two that weren't working so the church was not evenly cooled. It was cold in some spots and warm in others. Also, we will be installing temperature sensors around the church so that we have a nice even temperature throughout. Right now, the air conditioning thermostats are in the hallway to the sacristy which are convenient but don't give an adequate measure of the temperature in the church itself. I say this for those of you who are fearful that it's going to be too cold in the church but that shouldn't be the case.

I realized that spending money on these things when we're already operating at a deficit seems risky. But we truly need the doors to the building to work for safety reasons and ultimately, we need the air conditioning to work to make the space usable and comfortable. On the plus side of things, the new air conditioning units will bring in cooler outside air as needed rather than continually cooling and recycling the inside air. This should be a big savings for us especially at the beginning and the end of the cooling season. Sometimes you need to just cast your bread upon the water and hope that the Lord returns it with generosity. Therefore, I will try not to worry about the costs and trust that God and you will provide.

We have one more bulletin before the summer break. For those of you who are going away, remember us. We will still be live streaming the 10:00 o'clock Mass every Sunday. Have a safe and restful time and come back to us renewed that we may be about the work of building up the community of God.

In the Fall we will have a new time of stewardship, so, if you're not presently doing something in the parish, think about it this Summer. And if there's something you would like to see done in the parish by all means bring it to my attention. We can only change and grow as you change and grow.

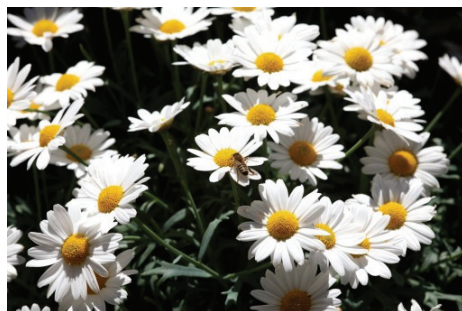
