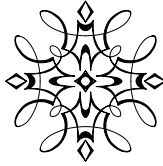

Peace and Goodness to All!

Last week we celebrated another St. Joan of Arc Day gathering with fun and enjoyment for all. I want to thank all of you who made this event a wonderful success. Many hands made this possible. For Ana Da Costa, this was a first and so Thank you Ana for gathering the troops who made all feel welcome at this jubilee. After the noon mass we were running low on water for the picnic, so it was said that John Kelly brought two cases of wine that were miraculously changed into water to meet the needs that Rosanne his wife pointed out to him. It reminded me of another miracle which is familiar to all who read John's gospel. It was eight years ago on the Feast of Joan of Arc, that I first came to serve the parish. We are grateful to all of the professional and volunteer singers and musicians who make our Liturgical celebrations sacred places of Praise and Worship to the Lord. May the Lord ever be enthroned on the praises of God's people.

The building committee has been working diligently not only on the boiler repair issues that are upon us, but also in placing an air conditioning unit in the office area with improvements in the ventilation and lighting that were long overdue to make these work spaces safe and comfortable for the staff. Ivan Kastelic, a fairly new member of the committee has been diligently overseeing these efforts and so a special thank you goes to him for his great efforts.

As the summer progresses we decided this year to suspend publication of the bulletin for the months of July and August. 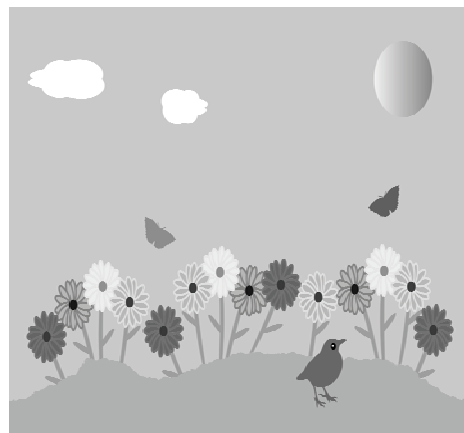
