The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to All!

This week, the parish staff gathered to plan the Lenten Stewardship Retreat to be held on Saturday April 12, in anticipation of Holy Week and Easter. It was a fruitful meeting which recalled the foundations of our current Stewardship Mission activities that began 5 years ago in a retreat that focused on the Eucharist as the Source and Summit of the parish Community. This theme was taken from the Liturgical Documents of Vatican II. At that time We reflected on the Eucharist especially at Sunday liturgies, both in terms of the growing quality of preparation made by our ministers, and the cooperation that has evolved between the ministerial groups like the lectors and the choirs as well as other liturgical ministers that enhances our gathering to worship the Lord with all we are and have.

Celebrating the Sunday Eucharist is the source and summit of our life as a parish, and Easter is the apex of all Sunday celebrations. Preparing to worship is a process involving prayerful reflection and intentionality that gathers all that we are and have. Every element of our life and its activities flows with prayer, into our awareness of God as the creator of all. God sustains us in life. Mindfulness of this truth, empowers us to embrace all that life brings so we can carry this into our worship as we gather each Sunday in our community of faith in Christ. The Eucharist remembers the life death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and unites each of us by the Holy Spirit, in the redemption won for us in this saving action of God.

Each year our liturgical celebrations reflect our growth and unity as a community of faith. The preparation time and effort we invest enable us to improve the coordination and quality of our worship. This permits us to make an impact on all who come here to experience the Lord present in the community as we welcome all to praise the Lord and share in the Redemption that was won for us in the paschal mysteries we remember in the liturgies. The annual liturgical retreat is presented each year to prepare us and open our hearts and lives to participate most fully in the divine mysteries we celebrate.

This year Christian McConnell PhD., the director of our Noon choir and the parish Liturgical Coordinator will be the key note speaker for the annual liturgy retreat. Chris is a professor at St. Michael's College at the University of Toronto. His expertise in Liturgical Celebration and Church Music is a gift he has shared in a professional capacity for Church leaders, and this year, he will grace our annual liturgical retreat with his insights and experience to assist us as we prepare to celebrate the most holy and sacred mysteries of Holy Week and Easter. We are opening the retreat on the morning of April 12, to the widest group of liturgical ministers and hope you will please make it a priority event. Please pray for the parish as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal events so we may most fully live and proclaim the gospel, and welcome many to celebrate the Lord with us in these holy days.
