The Friar's Nook

It's hard to believe that we're beginning Holy Week already. This Lenten season has gone by very rapidly for me. I hope it's been a fruitful season for you spiritually.

This Lent, we have been calling to mind those people who are invisible to us in society, and we are challenged by Pope Francis's words as we began Lent as to our response.

In his Lenten address the Pope said: "Today too, the cry of so many of our oppressed brothers and sisters rises to heaven. Let us ask ourselves: Do we hear that cry? Does it trouble us? Does it move us? All too many things keep us apart from each other, denying the fraternity that, from the beginning, binds us to one another." He challenges us to reflect on how we bearing the fruits of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving?

Our time to ready for Easter is upon us. Now is the time to bear fruit! We still have the Triduum ahead of us and I invite you all to be a part of it. On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. It differs from every other Mass we celebrate because we, as Jesus did, wash feet. He reminds us on the cusp of His death to humbly serve one another.

On Good Friday we will recall His Passion and death. This means nothing if we don't serve each other as He did. Jesus is not calling us to be crucified but to use the fruits of His Passion to love as we are loved.

On Holy Saturday, we will bless Easter foods and baskets at 2PM as a precursor to the great feast of Easter. Then, at 8:30PM we will begin the Solemn Vigil of Easter. Here we will recount all of salvation history to remind us of where we have been as a people and to where we are going. We gather around a blazing fire which then leads us to the waters of baptism. We will be initiating several people into the Church and renewing our own faith journey. I encourage you to be a part of these solemn celebrations to usher in the resurrection of the Lord.

On Easter Sunday we will be having coffee, tea, and cake after the Mass to celebrate with each other. Please come and share the goodness of the risen Lord.
