The Friar's Nook

Last Sunday we celebrated our first 12:00 o'clock noon Mass since we were closed down, due to the pandemic. There were only about 25 people present but for the first time, I think that's not too bad. In fact, I plan to announce to those who are watching the livestream, [if we can get it to finally work well again!] who may be afraid of exposure to others at Mass, that they can come to the 12 and have a pew all to themselves if they would like!

One of the greatest challenges that the church has had to deal with during the time of COVID is social isolation. Some people prefer it but as Christians we are called to be involved with each other and involved with God. Pope Francis said in his Lenten message this year that we need to let go of individualistic and self-reliant habits, and to refocus our hearts on God and on service to those in need. I fear that as a result of the pandemic we have lost many people in church, not due to death or sickness but rather to the habit of just not coming to church. Remember Christ said where two or three are gathered in my name there I am, stressing the importance of Christians gathering together in prayer. But inertia is a powerful force to overcome. I realized that those who read this are not the ones who need to hear this but rather those who are not here need to be challenged.

This means that is our job as Christians to spread the Good News, not just in foreign missions but right here at home, to encourage people to join us at mass. If you come to Mass and get something from it, then share that message with others and invite them to join you that they too may experience the goodness and grace of God in our community and help our community grow not simply in numbers but in spirit. I find it sad that we have lost so many people but I am encouraged by the new people who have come. As I have said before, we need a mix of the old and new to truly make this parish a place where "All are welcome."

As Pope Francis calls the church to be more synodal, that is more equal and diverse and listening to the members of the church, we need that same concept of Synod in the parish that we may serve one another with the grace of Christ and be a light for the world that they may see and wish to be part of the church.

What Parents Need to Know about the Sacrament of Baptism

Depending on the Church's Liturgical Calendar Baptisms are done at the Saturday and Sunday liturgies. Families that want to have their child baptized, must meet with the Sacramental Preparation Coordinator in person and submit the following:

In order to arrange a baptism, the following Archdiocesan requirements are necessary:

- 1)You must be a registered member of the parish and gather to pray regularly at the parish.
- 2) Complete a Baptismal Application Form
- 3) Submit the stipend of \$50.00 (cash or cheque payable to St. Joan of Arc, we are not set up for e-transfers)

Parents and godparents are required to attend a meeting with the religious Education, Sacramental Preparation Co-ordinator. Only one Roman Catholic godparent is required, traditionally most families pick two.

The Religious Ed office is open part time Tuesdays and Thursdays from \$10:00 am to 1:00 pm. Of course, it is always bet to call ahead of time to ensure that the office is open.
