The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to All!

We welcome Fr. Brian Terry SA, the Minister General of the Atonement Friars who is visiting us in Toronto this weekend. Fr. Brian will be celebrating the 10:00 AM Sunday Liturgy which will be served by the youth of our parish and the Confirmation Class of 2015. We thank these young people for their service as lectors, altar servers, ushers and greeters for the community. The youth bring us much life, vitality and hope in their service and Christian witness. Thank you to all of you who serve the parish so well in so many ways.

This week at the 7 PM liturgy we will celebrate the first of the three rites of scrutiny for the RCIA and RCIC programs. Since we will have adult and grown children's baptisms at Easter again this year, we will continue to use the readings from Cycle A, for the next three weeks which are appropriate for parishes which are celebrating the RCIA rituals. The Scrutinies will be celebrated at different times each week. Next Sunday the 8:30 mass will host the 2nd Scrutiny, and the following week it will be held at the 12:00 Noon mass. We stagger the times among the liturgies, so that the whole the parish can participate in supporting our RCIA candidates. Let us continue to pray for those who will be receiving the Easter Sacraments at the Pascal Vigil.

Last week four parishioners accompanied me to the Archdiocesan gathering for the "Family of Faith Campaign" wave 3 Inauguration. The packets and materials outlining the campaign were distributed so the program could begin after Easter. You will be receiving the mailings from the program in the coming weeks. Thank you all in advance for participating in this program which is important for the life and vitality of our Archdiocese and for our parish. Many of you know St. Cecilia's and other of our neighboring parishes have undergone this process, and have far exceeded their goals. Let us pray this program will be a success here as well.

You will notice we have decorated the sanctuary with pussy willows, nature's way of reminding us that spring and Lent correspond with the hope of new life and resurrection. The ministries committee was remembering when Sr. Judy had a group who decorated the church at every season to help us celebrate the liturgical year with new thematic focuses each year. If you are interested in leading or participating in a liturgical decoration committee please let me know. It would be a great blessing to the parish. In the old days there was something called the "Altar and Rosary Society who looked after the decoration and maintenance of the Sanctuary. We need to develop something new and appropriate to take on the tasks of liturgical decoration throughout the seasons.

As we continue together on our Lenten journey let us continue to pray for those who are so deeply persecuted for their faith, especially in the Middle East. Some members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and their young children in Syria have been isolated and tortured by ISIS, with threat of beheading. It is shocking and heartbreaking to see the passion of Christ continuing in our time in these ways. As we move toward the celebration of Holy Week and Easter, let us remember our unity with all Christians throughout the world.


