THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Welcome parishioners and Visitors to St. Joan of Arc Parish, Easter Joy and Blessings to all!

He is Risen as He said, Alleluia! The earliest disciples shared this joyful message from their experience and we continue to share it today from ours.

Each of Christ's disciples and friends encountered the risen Lord Jesus in different and mysterious ways. Mary Magdalene was the first. Matthew's Gospel recounts that Jesus tells her, "do not be afraid" and sends her forward with a message to the disciples. In John's gospel she meets Jesus whom she mistook for the gardener. It is only when He speaks her name that she recognizes him, and then, she is given her mission to tell the disciples. The gospels tell us they were reluctant to believe this truth.

Doubting Thomas personifies ones coming to believe only through a hands on experience. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus encountered the risen Jesus as a fellow traveler. He spoke the word of God in scriptures to explaining the meaning of Christ's death and resurrection. Then they recognized Him in the breaking of the bread and they recalled how their hearts were burning within them as He spoke. Gradually they all came to believe and rejoice.

When he appeared to the eleven disciples his message was clear: Peace be with you. As Jesus ate with them, and they had other experiences and encounters with the Risen Lord, they were prepared to receive the fullness of the truth and its meaning that continues to unfold in our lives today.

The gospel stories recall the first experiences of the Risen Lord. These form the basis for our Easter Proclamation that is repeated throughout the ages because the death and resurrection of the Lord is the eternal dynamic foundation of our faith. The meaning of this continues to be revealed and experienced in our lives and our shared relationships in the life of the Church. Throughout the year we gather to worship and share our faith. We nurture our parish committees and stewardship activities that witness to our faith and help others to encounter the risen Lord. A couple of weeks ago, the confirmation class encountered the Lord in their retreat experience with L'Arche especially in the "Spirit Dancers" who helped them to see that we are all One in the Body of Christ. Two weeks ago, we celebrated our annual Lenten Soup Night to raise alms for our outreach at the Winter Welcome Table. In the coming weeks of Easter up to Pentecost, we will celebrate First Communions, Confirmations, and many weddings. These continue the sacramental signs of the Risen Lord in our Midst.

This year, in our Easter Vigil we celebrated the baptism of five adults and four children. Additionally we celebrated the reception into the Church of six more adults and one child. These members of our community have experienced the meaning of the death and resurrection of the Lord as it is revealed through the life and teachings of the Church. They are a wonderful testament of living faith and the action of the Holy Spirit among us as a community. These new members bear witness to all of us that the Risen Lord Jesus continues to bring new life, freedom, and peace into our lives. We are grateful to these individuals who have encountered the Risen Lord Among us and we are grateful to God for bringing them into our community.

John's Gospel tells us that there are so many things that Jesus did, that there would not be enough room in the entire world to hold the books to record them. Jesus continues to pour out the blessings of His resurrection upon our parish, on the Church throughout the world, and on all people of good will. With God's continued nourishment, our relationships and good work will not be able to be contained in all the computer space in the world!

May the Risen Lord Jesus pour out Easter life and blessings on us all!
