The Friar's Nook

Resurrection

From the earliest times, Christians have left traces of their faith in the resurrection of Jesus and their own in their artistic monuments, so now I invite you to recall some of these.

There are two types of symbols and images: epigraphic (inscriptions) and iconographic (painted or sculpted images).

The first image is that of "sleep" or "dormition." The word "cemetery" itself means a bedroom. It is not a city of the dead, as the Hellenistic term implies, but rather a place where the living sleep temporarily.

By referring to the deceased, Christians expressed the belief that the body was deposited there as a pledge until the owner returns.

Even more expressive are the sculpted or painted images. A first group of images is made up of cyclical symbols of return. For example, the "peacock," which loses its feathers in the winter and grows them back in the spring. The image of the "phoenix" is also common, taken from pagan mythology. It is also a cyclical symbol, as it dies in the flames only to be reborn from its own ashes.

But perhaps the most beautiful of all is that of "Helios, the sun god," who revives at dawn after darkness. There is another group of very expressive figures. For example, the "shepherd carrying a sheep on his shoulders." Christians adopt this image, thinking of Christ who saves from death.

Another image is that of the "gates of Hades," which were only opened for entry and then closed forever. Among Christians, these gates appear open or even broken. Since Christ returned from the dead, they have remained open forever.
