Living the Gospel by supporting the Deaf community

Imagine you're a Deaf child and your parents don't know sign language. Your parents could gesture in a rudimentary way, but how do you share your joys, fears and needs? Silent Voice, a ShareLife agency, teaches American Sign Language and Deaf culture to families so they can share a common language. "I'm so passionate about Silent Voice," says one grateful parent, "because their Family Communication Program rescues children from social isolation." Last year more than 700 Deaf people and their family members received help through Silent Voice. June 7 is the next ShareLife Sunday. Please give generously.

Hopefully when everyone comes back, we will have a tree in full bloom, and you can inspect the tree and find your leaf! On a more personal note, Father Ken has had a death in the family. Please pray for his family and that he can make the trip home to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and get back into Canada afterwards.

I have been painting on the inside and weed-whacking like crazy on the outside so that the church looks good for your return. I have gotten several messages from the Archdiocese regarding the plans for reopening, but it's all moot until we have a date. Just know that there is a lot going on behind the scenes so that we can get back to full functioning. (No, I am not installing Plexiglas dividers in the pews!)

I understand that there were sound problems with Mass last Sunday. Sorry for that, everything was fine on our end, so I don't' know what happened. If I was preaching, I would have said that maybe you were lucky that you didn't have to listen to me. We will keep tying on our end.

I see the border is still for at least another month, so you have me all to yourselves. Although I have noticed my family members and parishioners from my last two parishes logging in to our mass and my bible study, so I am getting around - at least virtually.

Thank you for your prayers, wishes, and sometimes food. We are a family and I pray for each of you daily.


Bible Study
