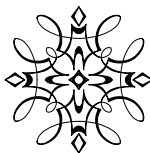

A New Satellite Office to Serve the Catholic Community

On May 5, Cardinal Thomas Collins blessed the Archdiocese of Toronto's new satellite office at 830 Bathurst St., just south of St. Peter's Parish. Originally call the Catholic Information Centre. "The location is excellent and easily accessible by transit, which is essential for both new refugees and youth – the two main user groups (with offices to serve them found) on the main level." The Office for Refugees at the Archdiocese of Toronto (ORAT) and the Office of Catholic Youth are the primary occupants, ORAT Director Deacon Rudy Ovcjak is impressed by the quality of the great space to work in, bright, clean and with a modern design. At the moment, the building is only accessible to the public by appointment, due to the pandemic, but it is sure to serve the faithful of the archdiocese for decades to come.
