Colours Green and Black

Green is used in the Masses of Ordinary Time. While Christmas is considered the beginning of Jesus' life and Easter the end, Ordinary Time does not celebrate a particular mystery but rather the totality of the mystery of Christ: his preaching, humility, lordship, humanity, divinity, and mission. This season follows Christmas until Lent and after Easter until Advent. The symbolism of the color green is associated with the world of nature and vegetation, evoking ideas of fertility, abundance, flourishing, and vigor. So, it is clear that tis colour is associated with the concept of Life in all its possible expressions and meanings. Perhaps from this comes its meaning of hope for the coming of the Messiah and hope for the saving Resurrection.

We can say that green is the color most used throughout the year, that is, on the greatest number of days

The colour black in liturgical vestments is permitted for the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed and for Masses for the Dead. Black vestments have a Paschal meaning. They are not entirely black: they are accompanied by silver or gold embroidery. In this way, the color symbolizes the pain and sadness experienced at the death of a loved one, but the embroidery symbolizes that this pain is illuminated by the Light of the Lord, who will wipe away our tears, and there will be no more crying (Rev 22:4).

In ancient times, the color black was worn on Good Friday. Purple vestments may also be worn at these celebrations. It seems better to use black vestments to distinguish one color for penance (purple) and another for mourning (black), following the ancient liturgical tradition.
