

# The Pastor's corner

Peace and Goodness to all!

I want to wish a Happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers, grandmothers and to all women in our lives who have loved us with the care and kindness of mothers. The care and love of our mothers is specially celebrated today. Mom's deliver their love, wisdom, hard work, care and concern every day we have them with us, and I believe my mom continues to pray for me in heaven.

Thank God we have one day each year that we all acknowledge our gratitude for the undying love they have given to us. It has been my experience also that often mothers are the chief teachers and transmitters of the gift of faith to all of us. I know that family prayer and the learning of religious matters in our family, was chiefly initiated by mom. When we were children, (oh yes there were 8 of us in our family) we went to St Teresa's School in Buffalo, NY and the primary tool for religious instruction was the Baltimore Catechism. This book listed our religious tenets in the format of various chapters with hundreds of questions and answers that the good Sisters in school demanded that we memorize. As my mother drilled us in our lessons it was not enough for her to hear the rote answers from the book. After we recited the answer she would then ask us to put it into our own words so she would be sure we understood what we were learning. Mom had a common sense approach to religion and a deep love of God and the Blessed Mother, that helped us to balance the rules and commandments with the reality of faith in real life.

It has been my experience that very often it is our mothers who help us develop a healthy relationship with the Lord and the Church. How can we thank them enough for their faith filled love so deeply shared.

Next week, the parish will celebrate the first communion of our school children with special appreciation for the mothers of these children who brought them into the world, cared for them and have been the first teachers of the faith that has prepared them to receive this wonderful sacrament. May God Bless our mothers richly with the most abundant blessings they so deeply deserve.

May is of course the month of Mary the mother of Christ, the mother of the Church. The Catholic Women's League will pray the rosary each Tuesday evening following the 5:30 pm Mass in special devotion to her. We thank the CWL for their devoted love of our parish and the Church. Certainly they deliver a mother's love and wisdom to us and so we extend our grateful thanks to them as well.
