The Friar's Nook

This past week we celebrated Remembrance Day. It got me to thinking that as Christians we shouldn't need a Remembrance Day or Thanksgiving Day because we are called to do these things all the time. But I realized, even in my life, that I need some reminding. It kind of gives a different meaning to Remembrance Day!

But as I said, we as Christians should live our lives remembering, not to live in the past but to realize the sacrifices and the challenges that were made that allow us to live in the present. And we should be grateful for those who faced those challenges and made those sacrifices. But more importantly, we need to remember so that we don't repeat history. As a nation as a church we need to move ever forward. In this time of pandemic, moving anywhere seems to be a challenge. And as we face challenges we can often turn inward, not in a thoughtful way but in a rather selfish way. We can begin to think that this is all there is and forget human history or we can think but this is all there is and forget Salvation history. Pain and suffering certainly draws us inward and sometimes causes us to lash out even at those who are trying to help.

Jesus himself felt tremendous pain. He was isolated, he was abandoned, he was betrayed. Yet even hanging on the cross he was able to think of others and ask for forgiveness for them. He recalled Salvation history as he cried out Psalm 22 "My God, my God why have you abandoned me". Although it sounds like he has given up, the psalm goes on to remember God's mercy and his work throughout the history of Israel and ends up giving God thanks. Jesus calls us to take up our cross each day and follow him. Perhaps that cross is one of remembrance and gratitude especially in the face of challenge and difficulty.

With a new wave of COVID shutdowns, we certainly live in an uncertain time. We can let the way of the world beat us down, or we can trust in the hand of God to get us through. I have been called a Pollyanna for my way of looking at things, but I know the power of God especially in times of great difficulty and challenge and I try to remember that every day! It is that power that makes me rise each day and give thanks to God remembering that He has been there in all things and He will be there in anything I face today.

As we are mindful this month to veterans, especially those who gave their lives, to those in our families who have died, and to those who make our lives possible each day by giving of themselves, we should link this to thanksgiving for what we have been given in the past, what we are given in the present, and what we are called to give in the future
