Included in those who paid ultimately with their lives in the service of the sick and the dying Irish were Bishop Michael Power, First Bishop of Toronto, Dr. George Robert Gresett, Chief Medical Office, Head Nurse Susan Bailey, Edward McElderry Triage Officer.. over 1100 Irish Refugees died in Toronto in the summer of 1847.
