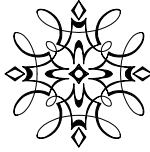
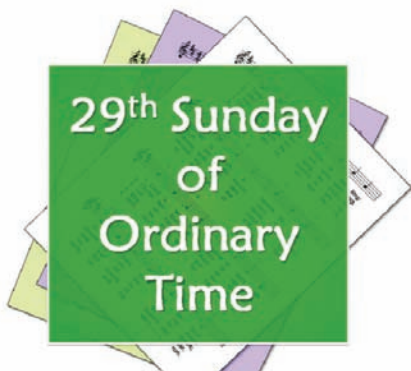

The Friar's Nook

As we begin the eucharistic prayer, we begin a dialogue with the priest and the congregation. I say this because it's not a performance of the priest but rather a dialogue between the priest and the congregation. As a priest I can tell you how dreadful it is when at a Mass I say "the Lord be with you" and there is silence that follows. And so, we begin the eucharistic prayer with a dialogue that goes back and forth until the presider goes into the prayer.

The first part of the prayer is called the preface and can be thematic for the feast of the day that we may be celebrating. It concludes with the Holy, Holy, Holy - the song of the angels at Jesus' birth. The prayer continues reminding us of Jesus command to love one another and then moves into the words of the Last Supper.

As the priest says the words of institution over the bread and wine, he performs several actions. After consecrating each of these he is to show the bread and the cup to the congregation celebrating. The emphasis is on the word show. He is simply called to raise the paten with the bread in it and the cup with the wine in it up off the altar so that people can clearly see. He is not supposed to elevate the gifts at this time. The practice of elevating the gifts during the consecration came when the priest had his back to the congregation as he celebrated Mass. In order for the congregation to see the bread and the wine the priest would need to hold it over his head. But after the second Vatican council when the priest was directed to turn and face the congregation there was no need of this as his body wasn't in the way.

That, being said I can't tell you the number of times I've seen priests elevate the gifts at this point. There is a time to elevate the gifts but that is not it. What it does when it's elevated after the words of institution is to make people think that at that moment the bread becomes the body of Christ and at that moment the wine becomes the blood of Christ when in fact it's the entire eucharistic prayer that causes this.

At this point the presider asks us to remember the mystery of faith, and acclamation for the congregation to make regarding what Christ did for our salvation thereby continuing the dialogue in this prayer. the rest of the eucharistic prayer connects us with the church and the world in our prayers as Christ came to redeem all of creation! The prayer concludes with the doxology, "Through him, with him, in him..." At this point, the water and wine made into the body and blood of Christ is elevated and the whole congregation boldly responds with an Amen.
