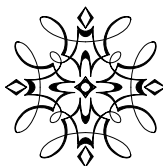

Persistence in prayer is the message of the Gospel this Sunday and it comes with the assurance from Jesus that prayer is effective and sure to be answered by God, Our Father to whom Jesus has taught his disciples to direct their prayers. Luke's gospel demonstrates the fact that Jesus spent long hours and even days in prayer before doing anything of importance. He spent 40 days in the desert absorbed in prayer and fasting before beginning his public life. He spent the night in prayer before calling his disciples. He prayed before delivering the Beatitudes, some of his most important teaching. He spoke of the need for prayer and fasting to his followers to be empowered for their ministry. Prayer is the way we develop a real substantial relationship with God who made us and fashioned us to realize his love in the world as we strive to Love God with all our strength, heart and soul, and so become prepared to love our neighbors as ourselves, fulfilling God's greatest command.

Prayer is what has brought us here today, as a whole community united in Faith that unites us in the Eucharist. Every one of us bring the particular details of our lives to this place. Some are here rejoicing in some good news or event that is occurring, to give thanks. Some are here to consciously praise God for the love and goodness that is God's. Some are here aware of their need of forgiveness. Some are here because they are mourning a loved one or seeking strength in sickness or to pray for someone who is going through a difficult struggle. Some are here to ask God for help or for some need. Some are here for all of these reasons. What is wonderful is that we are all here united in the need to pray no matter if life is going well, or we are suffering in some way. The Sunday gathering of God's faithful is a holy event that is given for us to realize the wonderful ways that God provides all that we have, life, healing, good relationships, help in life struggles, and meeting all of our many needs.

Sunday Eucharist provides a great opportunity to look around at the wonderful diversity of people who have come to offer prayers, petitions, thanks and praise and to rejoice that we are gathered to gather as one body united in the one voice of liturgical prayer. It is the place where we bring our whole lives and all the prayers we have prayed all week to offer them in the Holy Spirit through Jesus who prays to the Father that all may be one so the world may believe and celebrate God's love and goodness.
