

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

PEACE AND GOODNESS TO ALL!

It is good to be home after being in Hawaii for the week to run in the Ironman in Kona. The theme of the race this year was "Aa na maka o na aa". (The Sparkling eyes of my roots.) My sister Kate was with me. She ran this race 20 years ago she was great support and fun to be with for this time. We were given an opportunity to remember our own family roots. She was born on my twin and my first birthday. It was a wonderful week. On the first day while swimming in the ocean, I was surrounded by dozens of dolphins swimming in formations and jumping out of the water all around me. They came so close I could have touched them. It was breath taking and awesome to be welcomed to the island in such a dazzling way by God's creatures.

The race itself was on Saturday the 13th. There were 2100 contestants registered. Most of these are elite racers from all over the world. Others entered by a general lottery and I was in a special category, a legacy lottery for men and women who had run at least a dozen Ironman races over the years from the 33 Ironman venues throughout the world. Kona is the original.

The 3.8 k swim was in the ocean it was crowded in with 2100 swimmers who were not quite as friendly as the dolphins, but thank God I completed in good time. The 180k bicycle race was in windy hot and sunny conditions except for a rainstorm up in the mountains. The last 35 miles of the race was mostly a long slow climb into headwinds. Patient endurance was simply required. The 44.2 k run that followed for the likes of me was largely in the dark. I knew that it would be dark for much of the run portion, so I wore a head lamp. Thank God I thought to bring it. Interestingly many other runners surrounded me to take advantage of the light. I could not help but think of how the light of Christ that we hold by faith as Christians is one that draws others to remain close to us so we can find our way through life.

My sister volunteered at the medical tent as a nurse and so she was at the finish line to place the traditional Hawaiian lea around my neck, and greet me with a warm hug. How grateful to God I felt to be able to enjoy this race and finish in good form and good health.

I also want to thank all of you for your prayerful support and the generous contributions that you made toward continuing improvements of our parish facilities. It is good to be home and I will see most of you at the masses today. Thank you again, please know you are always in my heart and prayers.
