Thank you to all who have been keeping Fr. Raymond Luis, Fr. Mon in your prayers. This past Saturday was Fr. Mon's 41st birthday which was celebrated with a group of Atonement Friars who brought a home baked cake to his room at Toronto Western Hospital where he was recovering well. On Monday Fr. Mon was transferred to Princess Margaret Hospital for Radiation therapy to augment the success of his surgery. Please keep Fr. Mon in your prayers during this time. When I visited him, he asked me to thank all of you for your prayerful support.

The parish survey to determine our pastoral health in terms of our Spiritual, Social and Pastoral outreach to those in need was conducted at all the masses. This was an initiative taken by our Ministries Committee to follow up on the survey conducted 5 years ago with its promise to do this. We have received 438 completed surveys from the weekend. Our next steps will be to: 1) Continue to promote the survey with bulletin announcements and pulpit announcements. 2) Create a link for the website, and to point people to the paper copies at the back of the church, as we will continue to promote the survey until the weekend of November 12 and then close it off. 3) The ministries committee will process the material and begin to analyze it at our Next meeting on Nov. 21, when we will discuss reporting back to the parish the findings and suggestions you have proposed. Thank you all for giving us your feedback on this survey it a great help to us in fulfilling our mission to Live and proclaim the Gospel in Stewardship, so we may be a place to welcome all to encounter the and develop a meaningful relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ and to worship God whole heartedly.

Tuesday the Merrymakers gathered our seniors for a luncheon in the hall. Thank you to Louis Gris for preparing the wonderful meal for this and to Rose Di Tommaso for helping to organize and celebrate this monthly occasion. This is the 15th year that we have continued this great outreach to our senior community and we are always grateful to all who volunteer and participate in this lovely gathering.

This past Saturday the building committee and the gardening committee gathered folks for our semi-annual cleanup fix-up day to prepare the grounds and facility for the winter months. Michael Mc Gourty, the current pastor has continued to sponsor this ministry which is supported by our parish.
