This past week, from Monday afternoon to Thursday morning, I attended the annual gathering of the priests seminar sponsored by the Archdiocese at Nottawassaga Inn. "The Powerful Spiritual Leadership of a United Presbyterate" was the theme which focused on the Spiritual Leadership of Priests in the Universal Call to Holiness set forth by the Second Council of Vatican II. His Eminence Cardinal Thomas Collins addressed the gathering on Wednesday. Most of the teachings were delivered by Fr. Ron Knott whose inspirational writings promote the communitarian dimensions of Ordained ministry and the importance of the priests relationships with the people we serve. It was a refreshing time to gather in prayer and fellowship with other priests of the Archdiocese as together we contemplated these important values for parish ministry.

One of the priests I met at the workshop was Fr. Tim Sullivan CP, the new pastor at St. Peter's Church on Bathurst. We talked about resuming the covenant relationship that is shared by the Paulist Fathers, the Sisters of Our Lady of Sion and the Atonement Friars. This is the spiritual ground for the Winter Welcome Table that is sponsored by our two parishes. This ministry will resume in mid-December. It was delayed because of renovations taking place at St. Peters. It was good to meet Fr. Tim and to know we will once again be engaged in this important outreach to those we serve to bring a hot meal and fellowship during the cold winter months. The schedule for the various groups to participate in the preparation and serving of the meals will be posted in future bulletins, so please stay tuned.

Tuesday evening the Pastoral Committee met with Vivian Kwok to discuss the development of our religious education programs and to continue planning for our semi-annual ministries retreat in December. This retreat will prepare us to celebrate the Advent-Christmas season. It is a blessing to have such dedicated parishioners to take the initiative to deepen our appreciation of the seasonal liturgical celebrations that are the source and summit of our life as a parish.

Thanks to Mary Jago, the scripture studies and RCIA program continued in my absence, Mary brings a complimentary perspective to enhance the program. We continue to welcome individuals who are interested in a scriptural approach to Catholic teaching. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is also open to those adults who desire to become Catholic. Children who have not been baptized or who exceed the ordinary age for first communion and who wish to become integrated into the Church should contact Vivian Kwok in the religious education office.

A word of thanks also goes out to Anne Francis who did double duty this week while Rosanne was on holidays. Anne took care of the office calls as well as her ordinary stewardship of the finance office. Now that the autumn is here it is great to have everyone back and to see so many new members joining our parish community.

Please know you are welcome and we always invite you to participate in the life and ministry of the parish to whatever extent is possible for you. The web-site and the bulletin will help you to make contact with the stewards of our ministries so you can

become involved. Thank you all for making St. Joan of Arc Parish a vibrant witness to the love and service of Christ Jesus.

### CENTRAL PHILIPPINES EARTHQUAKE

The Archdiocese is now accepting donation in aid of the earthquake of October 15th The earthquake, centred about 620 km southeast of Manila, has been blamed for more than 160 deaths so far, with hundreds of people injured and dozens still missing. Government reports suggest more than 158,000 people have been displaced, with 100,000 of them were housed in 85 evacuation centres.. Local funds from the local church are also being tapped to also provide emergency assistance to the affected localities.
