

# The Friar's Nook

### Peace and Goodness to all!

Things are beginning to slowly ramp up here at Saint Joan of Arc. I hope your summer vacations we're good and you got some time to be with those your love and to relax and refresh. I have seen more people at church these past weekends, which is a nice thing. The 10:00 o'clock Mass has almost reached its capacity. Remember that when it does, the doors will be closed. So, if you're thinking of arriving at the last minute you may have a rude surprise. Given that, I thought by now we would have at least one more Mass on Sundays. In order for this to happen though we need volunteers to usher as we do at the 5:30 Mass on Saturday and at the 10 o'clock Mass on Sunday. They basically welcome people in, make sure they stay socially distant and have masks on, and then seat them at an available space in the church. At communion time, they usher them down the aisle to receive communion. At the end of Mass, they helped to empty the church so that everyone stays socially distant and then they help sanitise the church. As it stands now, we have fewer people doing this for the 5:30 Mass and the 10:00 AM Mass than we had at the beginning. This is not due to streamlining the process but rather we've had some people drop out. Therefore, we need help at the existing Masses we presently have in order to continue having them safely.

I ask you if you are regularly attending one of the weekend Masses that you consider offering help at either of these Masses. The more people we have who volunteer the less you would be scheduled to help out. If I hear from enough people who are willing to usher at an additional Mass, I will happily put one back in the schedule.

I've still had problems live streaming the Sunday Mass. So, I've decided that I will record the mass as well as live stream it and if there's a problem with the live stream I will upload the recording for you to watch at home. I realize that it's not an ideal solution but I'm at the limit of my knowledge on how to get it Facebook to work perfectly each week. Those of you who were watching from home last week so nothing. I'm sorry about that, on my end it showed that it was streaming. I'm even sorrier as you missed seeing something at mass that those who attended got to witness. My dog Sonya came out of the sacristy and laid down in the sanctuary during communion. I think she was thinking that I was giving treats out to everybody, and she was waiting her turn. It was very cute, and she waited there to the end of Mass when we walked back into the sacristy. [And then I gave her a treat] Unlike many people, she doesn't like to be away from me. When I went to the dentist, she howled the entire time I was away. She is getting braver though and hopefully will do even better when she has four legs to stand on. I've noticed her at the dog park looking longingly at the dogs who run around unencumbered I think she would like to join them.

This week, I will be at Graymoor to attend meetings for the first time in a year and a half! It will be so nice not to have to Zoom twice a week with them and it will be good to see my fellow Friars. I have to drive this time which I'm not looking forward to, but I should be able to fly in the future so that I don't have to spend two extra days away.

Please consider life at the parish after COVID, we're here for you!


