

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

It is harvest time in the Interfaith Garden. That might sound a bit apocalyptic, but it isn't about some mystical reality that I speak, but about the Interfaith Garden that is situated behind St. Joan of Arc Church and Friary garage, that adjoins the land behind Redeemer Lutheran Church next door. This garden, which was dedicated specially on St. Joan of Arc Day this past spring, is cared for by an interfaith group of individuals who grow vegetables for various charitable meal centers throughout Toronto. Louis Gris, one of our parishioners, is the point person who has been managing our part in the venture. Recently, he and the other volunteers created an opening in our fence to make the two properties available for greater planting space. It is a wonderful ministry that helps us to realize that the Lord provides food and blessing for all and that we share in God's providence as one people. They are putting in a gate next week so this shared space will be accessible for those who work the garden.

Ben Franklin, the famous inventor and statesman from the 18th century, wrote in Poor Richard's almanac, "Good fences make good neighbors". Since the garden ends at the Friary Garden, where quiet and privacy is appreciated, the Building Committee proposed a way to create a privacy fence with a gate to maintain the quiet character of the flower garden and patio for the Friary while the industry of the vegetable ministry is carried on.

Last week, Barry Carolyn and our William Medeiros, with the help of Barry's children, Ned, Lucy and Simon, began building a beautiful wooden fence with a lattice crown at the east end of the Friary garden which creates a lovely border. Stairs to a gate open to the Interfaith Garden. Barry is a science teacher who would be quite familiar with Ben Franklin's scientific contributions to humanity. He is also a very talented carpenter who appreciates the aesthetical value of the contemplative space that has been protected. It was wonderful to see this family work together last Saturday. Ned and Lucy were very helpful to their dad, and Simon, who is about three years old, demonstrated his ability to hammer wood with great concentration, even if it didn't involve using nails. Rene Bruneau, chairman of our Building Maintenance Committee, was part of the planning group to mastermind this project and will be contributing his ancient post removing tools and efforts to the completion of the effort.

The Interfaith Garden and this little project demonstrate a part of the Stewardship spirit that is the foundation of our Parish life and community and I am grateful to all who participate so generously of their time, talent and treasures to make St. Joan of Arc the wonderful parish it is. Thank you especially to Barry, Ned, Lucy and Simon and to the Building Maintenance Committee. Your work and forward-looking planning for our needs is an invaluable contribution to the parish. May God Bless you.
