

ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

Registration for the annual Oratory Summer School has opened. There are two sessions available. The first session offers a systematic introduction to The Catechism of The Catholic Church. The second session takes Jubilee Years as its theme, converging appropriately with 2025 being celebrated as a Jubilee Year in the universal Church and with the Toronto Oratory's own 50th anniversary, for St. Philip himself directed a confraternity dedicated to the care of Jubilee pilgrims in Rome. We shall study, among other topics, the theology and history of jubilees, Saint Philip's special association with Jubilees and the theme of the Church's Jubilee this year: Pilgrims of Hope. The first session will be July 7 to 11 and the second session July 14 to 18. The cost for each session, which includes lunch each day for those attending in person, is \$200 per person. For those attending online, the cost is \$175 per person. Accommodation is available in the seminary for \$100 per person, which covers the entire week. CHRIST IS RISEN!

A Blessed Easter to all parishioners. Many thanks to all who have helped to make our Holy Week celebrations beautiful. May all of us rejoice in the Lord's mercy and continue in this Easter season with the joy of renewed hearts.

FORTY HOURS

Why solemnly expose the Holy Eucharist on the altar for forty hours? The tradition began in Milan in 1535. A saint was begging the Lord for a special favour. The saint realized that Our Lord was dead for forty hours.

Our Lord died at the "ninth hour." With the day beginning with the sunrise at 6 a.m., the ninth hour was 3 p.m. Our Lord was carried to the tomb in the nearby garden. He rested in the tomb all of Saturday. He rose early in the morning on Sunday. 7 a.m. is the first hour. When we add up the hours of these three days, the total is forty: 9 + 24 + 7 = 40.



Good Friday 3 p.m. \rightarrow midnight **Holy Saturday** = 24 hours. **Easter Sunday**: 12 a.m. \rightarrow 7 a.m.

The devotion of the Forty Hours was introduced into Rome by St Philip Neri, the founder of the Oratorians. He would organize adorers for *an hour at a time*. He would even keep a bell there. He would ring the bell at the end of an hour and say: "the hour of prayer is over, but the time for doing good is not over yet."

In imitation of St Philip, the Oratorians have been great promoters of the Forty Hours. Every October, the devotion is celebrated with beauty at Holy Family church. Occasionally, we have tried hosting it at St Vincent's.

This week Our Lord wants to be visited. He once told a priest: *place me on the altar and I will do the rest.* Currently, we have many special needs. Twenty children are about to receive First Holy Communion on Sunday, April 27. Our pastor is celebrating forty years as a priest today! Our country is about to have an election. Let us pray for great graces.

What was the greatest favour ever received? The Resurrection of Christ. People prayed for forty hours in preparation for the Resurrection, the miracle of miracles. Let us watch with the Lord for an hour. Let pray for our parish, our pastor, and our country. Christ is alive. Come, let us adore Him! Alleluia!
