THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY – A LITTLE BIT OF CANADIANA

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Family. You may be surprised to learn that it is a relatively recent feast. It has been in the Church's universal calendar only since 1921. But the devotion goes back to the seventeenth century and should have a special interest for Canadians, because it took root and grew among the early French missionaries and colonists.

If you go to Martyrs' Shrine in Midland, you will find a plaque in the parish hall beneath the church highlighting the contribution of the Jesuit Fr Joseph Marie Chaumonot. It says that he "did much to initiate devotion to the most holy family that ever lived, among the Hurons in Huronia and later in Quebec. Devotion to the Holy Family, which became world-wide in the Church, had its early beginnings in Ste Marie." Fr Chaumonot arrived in Huronia in 1639 and went on a long and difficult missionary journey with Saint Jean de Brebeuf. When the remnant of the Huron nation decided to abandon Huronia and live under French protection near Quebec City, Fr Chaumonot was assigned to be their chaplain. He died in Quebec City in 1693, his last words being "Jesus, Mary, and Joseph".

When Pope Leo XIII approved a limited feast of the Holy Family, he wrote: "The worship of the Holy Family was established in America, in the region of Canada, where it became most flourishing, thanks chiefly to the solicitude and activity of the venerable servant of God, François de Montmorency Laval, first Bishop of Quebec, and of God's worthy handmaiden, Marguerite Bourgeoys." But the devotion came to the attention of Bishop Laval in 1663 through a petition from Fr Chaumonot for approval of an association of the Holy Family, which was very much supported by various people living in Montreal at the time, including Ste Marguerite Bourgeoys. One can trace devotion to the Holy Family even further back in time to France, because Fr Chaumonot was inspired by a book of prayers to the Holy Family that had been printed for some persons there who practiced this devotion. But it was in Canada that the devotion took root and flourished.




