UPDATE ON OUR STATUES

As you can see, and as many parishioners have commented on, St Joseph, St Therese and St Anthony are back in the church. The historical research by our anniversary committee under the leadership of Kathleen McGinnis has influenced the decision as to where to put them. It is clear from a very fuzzy old photo (strangely enough) in a brochure published by our first pastor Father Minehan at the time the church was dedicated in 1923 that statues other than the Sacred Heart and Our Lady were on the walls of the nave. (It is not clear which statues were where; one thing that we do know is that St Therese was a later addition: she was canonized in 1925, and her statue came into the church several years after that, thanks to the devotion of our second pastor, Father (later Monsignor) Kirby.

The statue of St Vincent was donated to the parish by the Toronto councils of the St Vincent de Paul Society. We have not yet determined where he originally stood. The decision we have reached is to keep him close to the people, which seems to be appropriate for him. He will remain in the area where he has been standing for some months, raised up, but not so high as the other statues are. Marbles of Portugal on nearby Dublin Street have donated a piece of black marble to make a stand for him on top of what is now the baptismal font. No longer will he fool us into thinking that he is waiting in line for confession -- that's your job! This means we will have to get a new baptismal font in the not too-distant future.

The restoration of St Vincent's statue remains to be done. We were mistaken some time back in thinking that the work was imminent; the company doing it has had some big projects on the go. We will keep you posted.
