

#### IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Through the centuries, the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses,



as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1854: The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin.

The "splendor of an entirely unique holiness" by which Mary is "enriched from the first instant of her conception" comes wholly from Christ: she is "redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son". The Father blessed Mary more than any other created person "in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" and chose her "in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before him in love". (CCC 491-492)

# ORATORY CORNER -- 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Newman in a Nutshell, part 4

In the *Grammar of Assent*, St John Henry Newman, the second founder of the Oratory, deals with two questions: 1) how can we believe what we do not understand and 2) how can we believe what we cannot prove. He is convinced that we do so through the help of the imagination. The imagination allows us to form an image of something we cannot see. Newman knows that what is real, what actually exists, is individual, concrete, a unit. We make real to ourselves these concrete things though forming an image of them.

God exists. But how can we make real to ourselves that the one God sees us and knows us? Newman thinks it is through the experience of conscience. Conscience gives us a law for acting. If there is a law, there must be a Lawgiver. Conscience makes demands on us. But demands suggest someone demanding. When we follow our conscience, we *experience* a peace and joy similar to when we follow the commands of a parent. Conscience thus enables us to form an image of a *Moral Governor* who sees all that we do. We can apprehend the one God through these experiences. We cannot understand fully the mystery of God, but we can assent to his Reality.

During Advent, we want to relive the ancient expectations of the Old Testament. The four weeks of Advent correspond to the 4000 years of written human history before Christ that are recounted in the Scriptures. The great message of the Old Testament is that God exists. And the God who exists in One. *I am the Lord your God and there is no other (Isaiah 45:5)*. This one God chose one people, the Jews, in order to bring one Saviour who would save the world. Through one people, the one God would bless all peoples. Let us pray in Advent for greater faith in God. Let us believe that the One God who is good and sees our misery wants to help us. Let us read the Old Testament!
