



ORATORY CORNER

Newman in a Nutshell 10.0

St John Henry Newman (1801-90) was just added to the universal Calendar of the Catholic Church. His feast on October 9 is now able to be celebrated all over the world. The Church sees him as a special teacher for our times. The last few weeks, we have looked at his teaching on original sin. We have seen him say two things: 1) the doctrine of original sin has been revealed by God and 2) human beings can reflect on the world in a way that almost proves this doctrine.

Why do human beings look for the evidence for our faith? If God has told us something is true and we accept it unconditionally, why think about the grounds or reasons for the doctrine? Newman says this: "[There is] an assent, not only to a given proposition, but to the claim of that proposition on our assent as true; it is an assent to an assent, or what is commonly called a conviction" (*Grammar of Assent*, ch 6). In the case of original sin, we assent to the proposition that humanity rebelled against God. But when we assent to the assent, when we know that we know, we have a conviction about original sin. We not only know it is true because God said it, but we know that the teaching demands our assent as true.

When we reflect on our faith, when we reflect on the reasons why what we believe is true, we can know that a given teaching to be, in Newman's words, "objectively true as well as subjectively" (*Grammar of Assent*, ch 6). We not only know it is true because Newman will say that our faith, our assent of faith becomes "a certitude, the proposition or truth a certainty, or thing known, or a matter of knowledge, and to assent to it is to know."


