THREE GLORIOUS MARTYRS OF THE EARLY CHURCH

St. Sebastian became a soldier in the Roman army in about 283 and was named captain in the praetorian guards by the Emperor Diocletian. He did not know that Sebastian was a Christian. When it was discovered, he was ordered executed by the same Emperor. He was shot with arrows and left for dead, but when the widow of St. Castulus went to recover his body, she found he was still alive and nursed him back to health. Soon after, Sebastian intercepted Diocletian, denounced him for his cruelty to Christians, and was beaten to death on the Emperor's orders.

St. Vincent was born at Huesca in Spain but lived in Saragossa. Vincent served as the deacon of Valerius of Saragossa, the city's bishop. Imprisoned in Valencia for his faith, and tortured on a gridiron, Vincent was martyred under the Roman Emperor Diocletian in 304. Like many early martyrs in the early hagiographic literature, he succeeded in converting his jailer. Though he was finally offered release if he would consign Scripture to the fire, Vincent refused. The earliest account of Vincent's martyrdom is in a lyric poem written by the poet Prudentius, who describes how Vincent was brought to trial along with his bishop Valerius, and that since Valerius had a speech impediment, Vincent spoke for both, but that his outspoken fearless manner so angered the governor that Vincent was tortured and martyred, though his aged bishop was only exiled.

St. Agnes was twelve years old when she was led to the altar of Minerva at Rome in 304 and commanded to obey the persecuting laws of Diocletian by offering incense. In the midst of the idolatrous rites she raised her hands to Christ, her Spouse, and made the sign of the life-giving cross. She did not shrink when she was bound hand and foot, though the manacles slipped from her young hands, and the heathens who stood around were moved to tears. Bonds were not needed for her; she hastened gladly to the place of her torture. At length the sentence of death by the sword was passed upon her. A week after her death, St. Agnes appeared to her parents as they were praying at her tomb; she was amid a choir of virgins clothed in golden robes and crowned with garlands. She begged them not to weep for her as for one dead, telling them rather to rejoice with her in her happiness.


