Please note that you can deregister yourself in case you are feeling sick or need to change your plans.

There will be Confessions before all Masses, and we will continue to have Confessions on Friday morning from 11 a.m. to 12 noon

We are required under the city of Toronto by-law to wear masks in church, unless you are exempted. Sanitizing materials are available in the church for you to sanitize the place where you are praying. If a pew is not going to be used again within an hour it does not need to be sanitized. Sanitizing, therefore, will not be needed Monday to Saturday, but will be needed on Sunday.

ORATORY THEOLOGY SUMMER SCHOOL

Each year there are two week-long sessions, with three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers or Brothers of the Oratory. The fee for each session is \$150. Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.

Session 2: July 12 – 16

The topic for the Second Session will be The Protestant Reformation and the Catholic Response. We will look at this complicated affair from a variety of angles (historical, political, theological and even artistic), drawing on official Church documents from the Fifth Lateran Council and the Council of Trent as well as the lives of the saints from the period. We will address such enduring topics as the constant need for reform within the Church, the place of Scripture in the Church, the importance of our sacramental life, and the call to a deeper spiritual life, a life dedicated to the pursuit of holiness. These events triggered an outpouring of activity within the Church, a movement called the Counter-Reformation that has helped form the Church for the past five centuries. With a period so complex and interesting, the trouble is not figuring out what to talk about, but deciding what to leave out! OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

July 16 is the day that the Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Mount Carmel is the mountain in the middle of the plain of Galilee on which the prophet Elijah called down a miracle of fire from the Lord, to show the people of Israel who had strayed that "The Lord is God!" and that the prophets of Baal were worshipping a false god.

A group of monks in the 13th century began living and praying on the mountain. They venerated the Virgin Mary as Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and from this veneration was derived the name Carmelite.

In 1226, the rule of the order was approved by Pope Honorius III, and 21 years later St. Simon Stock, an Englishman, was elected superior of the order. On July 16, 1251, the Blessed Virgin appeared to Simon and gave him the brown scapular and promised her protection to all those who wear the brown habit.
